

There were available tie downs just south of taxiway Charlie right in front of the administration building.




This is the interior of the terminal building. These lovely benches were redone by a local craftsman.



Chandler field is one of the oldest operating airfield in California and many of the art deco buildings from the WPA era are well preserved and cared for and from the <u>Chandler Historic District</u>.

We then Ubered the nine miles north to the <u>Forestiere Underground Gardens</u>. These "gardens" are an odd villa constructed by a Sicilian immigrant in the first part of the twentieth century. They are fascinating and our tour guide really brought them to life.
